

Read. Watch. Go. Do.

deeds.' Show me your faith without deeds, and I will show you my faith by my deeds." James 2:17-18

I think we're all on the same page with James-faith without works is dead. If my actions don't match my words, then I'm not very trustworthy. If I can't actually walk the walk, then how much is my talk worth? I'd venture to say very little. We all agree on this one, but the difficult part becomes when we try to figure out what to do about it. How can I act out my faith? How can I show the world that I'm a Christian?

Let me suggest a mantra l've been using for the past year or so: Read. Watch. Go. Do. Living out your faith doesn't mean you have to wear a sandwich board on the streetcorner, but it means that you are consistently growing and stretching in your faith in ways that just seem to explode out of you because they cannot be contained. So when you ask yourself, "what could I be doing to grow my faith? How can I show my faith to others?" try using these words as a starting off point:

-Read. Is there a devotional book or author you've been wanting to try? Or do you wish you read your Bible more? Now's a great time to get started!

-Watch. There are so many great movies/documentaries/tv shows about the Bible. Sometimes the only way to know if you will learn something is by trying something new.

-Go. Get out there in the world and have a conversation with someone. It can be a friend, a family member, a neighbor, or a stranger-just tell them something that God has done in your life today that you are thankful for.

-Do. Do you see places of need in the world around you? Don't just stand there-do something! Volunteer at a non-profit organization, share your time and care with a lonely neighbor, open your pantry and donate some food to an organization that feeds the hungry. There is so much we can do right where we are.

Read. Watch. Go. Do. Four simple little things, but they can make a world of difference not only to others, but to our own lives as well. Faith without works is dead, so let's get to work.


