Who, me? Yes, you!

The Bible is filled with people who don't feel up to the challenge of serving God, speaking for God or leading his people. But God always knows what he's doing. Pastor Haviland Houston issues this challenge: "When you are hesitant to act, or feel a failure of nerve coming on, when courage lags, or even if laziness and the 'I don't care' blues get you down, may the words of Mordecai to Esther burn in your hearts and minds: 'And who knows whether you have not come to the kingdom for such a time as this?"' (See Esther 4:14.)


Max Lucado offers a similar reminder in You Were Made for This Moment. "God always has his person," he writes, also citing the book of Esther. "When we feel as though everything is falling apart, God is working in our midst, causing everything to fall into place. He is the King of quiet providence, and he invites you and me to partner with him in his work."

Lucado continues: "[God] has a Joseph for every famine and a David for every Goliath. When his people need rescuing, God calls a Rahab into service. When a baby Moses needs a mama, God prompts an Egyptian princess to have compassion. He always has his person. He had someone in the story of Esther. And in your story he has you."

The Pastor's Piece

"Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" Jesus said to him, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets." Matthew 22:36-40

I made a decision recently: if it doesn't show grace, it needs to go. If it doesn't bring life to myself and the people around me and in the world, there is no need for it. We tend to get so caught up in everything going on around us that we forget what is truly important: loving God, loving our neighbors, and loving ourselves. During World War II, children were often sent from areas of heavy bombing to homes in the countryside. One night, the adults found some kids holding on to their bread instead of eating it. When questioned about it, they children replied that they wanted to be sure that they would have bread the next day: they wanted to hold on to what would give them life. Out of this story, the spiritual practice of the Examen was born. The Examen consists of asking yourself questions in two areas every night:

1. What gives you life? What was the best part of your day? What makes you smile and gives you energy?

2. What drains life from you? What was the worst part of your day? What brings you down and zaps your energy?

The idea is that if we answer these questions every day, certain patterns emerge. And as people of God, the patterns that emerge tend to fall in line with the Great Commandment: loving God, loving our neighbors, and loving ourselves. Hopefully what we learn about ourselves and our lives is that the things that are centered around God are the ones that bring us joy and life and fill us with energy. So what brings you joy and makes you smile? Is it showing grace to others? Is it spending time with God in prayer and devotion? I know that there are some things we have to do that you might not think of as life giving, but for me paying the electric bill is a resurrection activity-air conditioning gives me joy right now! What is of God is true, authentic worship which we have together each week. Resurrection activities share grace and love just as God has shared it with us. So what gives you life right now? What is the best part of your day? What makes you smile? Do more of that. If it doesn't show grace, it needs to go. As the people of God we don't need it anyway.
